Bindu Puri is Professor of Philosophy at the Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, India and the Chair of the Centre for Philosophy in the School of Social Sciences of the university. Her main interests in philosophy are in the areas of political philosophy, moral philosophy and contemporary Indian philosophy. She is a leading scholar on the thought and practice of Mahatma Gandhi. Professor Puri has published extensively in edited anthologies and philosophical and interdisciplinary journals and has authored two books: *Gandhi and the Moral Life* (2004) and *The Tagore-Gandhi Debate: On Matters of Truth and Untruth* (2015). She has also edited or co-edited eight books including *Mahatma Gandhi and his Contemporaries* (2001).
